Lectionary readings for Third Sunday of Advent December 14, 2025

> Isaiah 35:1-10 Psalm 146:5-10 James 5:7-10 Matthew 11:2-11

Isaiah 35:1-10

The desert and the dry land will be glad; the wilderness will rejoice and blossom like the crocus. They will burst into bloom, and rejoice with joy and singing.

There's something about the cold and snow that I really appreciate (besides reminding us that it's time for Santa in the Cabin!); it helps us remember to slow down. The icy conditions remind us to tread carefully; intentionally. Going out into the bracing chill rewards us with breathtaking skies and migrating birds. I appreciate how the plants that have gone to seed put on a display of abundance. A stroll through the snow contrasts beautifully with the dried brown flora. I like how the trees in winter reveal their branches and various nests.

Winter is also the time when trees send energy down into their roots. While animals look to them for shelter, they are still pushing earth; hidden from sight, they still grow.

Before his public ministry, the Holy Family and Jesus lived out of sight. They were so plain that no one took notice, yet they fruitfully manifested the promises of God. Among his followers were people who were overlooked. They were both achingly poor and ordinary, yet also able to catch the attention of wise ones from the east and dangerous rulers closer to home. God chose to become enfleshed in the life of Jesus surrounded by people of humble origins and die a criminal's death with only his closest female companions standing near.

In order to set us free, God put on vulnerability, as a baby, disarming our understanding of strength and power.

We are wise to revisit the Christmas story with attention to what's tender, what's gentle, and what's true. Advent is preparation for a love revolution that came down at Christmas.

God promised through Isaiah that the dry places and deserts will bloom and rejoice. May Jesus' life be our Joy; the spirit within us singing and praising like a desert after the rain.

Nurture dormant seeds of light and love into glorious flower this season. Your joy, your rest, your radical self-acceptance honor God's holy watering of the dry places.

## **Tuesday Morning Meditation**



#### Weekly on Tuesday Log Cabin or Online 10:30 AM CDT

Join us as we gather to practice Lectio divina on the weekly lectionary readings.

**Lectio divina** is a contemplative practice with its Christian roots in the Benedictine tradition. It combines slow, conscious

reading of a biblical or sacred text with contemplation and silent prayer. It is meant to promote communication with God and a deeper knowledge of Christ, in our lives today.

During Lectio Divina we put aside thoughts of studying the text. This is not the time to consider the historical or theological meanings of what we are reading. We read with a willingness to enter into text in a felt sense. The purpose of this practice is to hear, in silence, the word of God, in this moment. What, through this reading, is God saying to me right now? What do I hear that helps me know what it means to walk the Christ path today?

Lectio Divina has traditionally been a communal practice; that is, one shared when in a group but it can be done when alone.
