Lectionary readings for Palm Sunday March 24, 2024

Psalm 118:1-2, 19-29 Mark 11:1-11 Isaiah 50:4-9a Psalm 31:9-16 Philippians 2:5-11 Mark 14:1-15:47 A friend recently told me they'd much rather attend a funeral than a wedding. It wasn't because of the ceremony or the persons up front, but the attendees.

Their logic is that people are invited to a wedding. But funeralgoers don't have to be invited. They are there out of respect and admiration for the deceased and their loved ones.

This Sunday, we celebrate Palm Sunday, Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem on a donkey. The service also has the story of Jesus' passion, his betrayal, arrest, trial and execution.

It is unsettling to go from hopeful shouts of 'Hosanna" to bitter cries of "Crucify him." Sunday's service follows the last days of Jesus' life: the praise and confidence as well as the tragedy of the cross and tomb.

Rev Garnaas Holmes writes, "The cross is God's non-violent resistance to our sin: God exposes and overcomes our violence and our separation from God."


God judges all oppression. Even if the reasons are "righteous," we hurt God when we hurt others. Instead of punishment and retribution, God forgives us and reunites with us, setting us free from the power of sin.

This Holy Week isn't a funeral invitation, exactly. But it is an invitation to worship our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It is an invitation to take up our crosses: to identify our complicity in oppression and violence. And to turn towards the new life Christ sets us free for.

Hosanna, Son of God! Save us, indeed. May your Holy Week be especially blessed.


